



Set Sail this Winter on a Northern Lights Quest with PONANT



28 October 2024 | Beyond the Arctic Circle, when the winter sun is only visible for a few minutes a day, strange curtains of emerald green lights illuminate the sky. These are the Northern Lights, a fascinating phenomenon that PONANT guests may witness during their exploration of the Far North this winter.

Discovering the Northern Lights


A pioneer and expert in polar exploration cruises, PONANT has crafted itineraries for winter 2025 to maximise encounters with the Northern Lights. The time of year and latitude are ideal for observing these luminescent circulations that have fired the imaginations and fascinated humans since Antiquity:

- On board the warm and refined cocoon of PONANT ships, common areas which are largely open to the outdoors, and the staterooms, all with balconies, allow guests to immerse themselves in the Northern Lights magic.
- Ashore during ports of call, excursions with local guides continue the lights quest. After having coffee under the lavu¹ set up on the snowy expanses of the tundra, the evening begins... and with a little luck, the magic begins!

The Northern Lights, A Natural Phenomenon Behind Many Legends



Northern Lights occur when particles from powerful solar storms are projected into space. It takes them four days to travel the 150 million kilometres that separate the Sun from the Earth. Some of these particles are drawn to the earth's magnetic poles and, on contact with the earth's atmosphere, a tremendous energy is released, made visible by colours to the naked eye: **these are the Northern Lights.** The intensity of the colours, dancing in the polar night, arouses deep emotions in all those who are lucky enough to witness the phenomenon.

Before science provided an explanation, the Northern Lights gave rise to myths and legends among peoples in the Far North, like the Inuits in Greenland and the Samis in Scandinavia. Indigenous peoples' beliefs and their spirituality are explained on board during lectures by naturalist guides, who are experts in these regions.

"Sami people are animists, they believe in spirits; for the elders, the Northern Lights represent the tail of the red fire fox running across the sky".

At the end of the Arctic winter, Norway's stunning scenery awaits the traveler who loves wide-open spaces where nature reigns supreme. From the Lofoten Islands to the North Cape, PONANT's destination experts have selected ports of call and activities to offer an experience that is as intense as it is varied: embracing traditions and customs of the Sami people; dog sledding or snowshoeing (depending on the weather and snow conditions); visiting local villages with their wooden houses and churches; or bird watching (ski-las, guillemots, puffins and many others). One excursion per guest per port of call is included.³
